STONE & GARDENS

Gardening in North Otago

13th February 2018 North Otago weather this month is a Gardeners dream - cooler nights, still days, warmth and rain. All trees, shrubs, plants and Gardeners should be thriving, as I am with many trays

of seedlings doubling in size daily and compost heaps breaking down nicely.

Bob has had the hedge trimmer on the go here again. If you think something in your garden needs a cut back - do it now... At this time of the year, you can trim back quite hard if needed, as the grow back rate is pretty quick- even if the plant is still producing flowers, but if you notice there are more seed heads than flowers, it's a good indication the plant or bush is ready for a trim.

Keep dead heading Roses and Dahlias to get continuous flowering. I have also been dead heading Lavender, Catmint, Geranium - and cutting hard back Bush Lavatera and Buddleias, (the Butterfly bush) tall thin arching branches with grey/blue leaves and lavender, purple or pink long narrow flowers that will have faded now.

I noticed some potted annuals looking looking a bit yellow in the leaves. When I investigated further, the affected pots had drain holes blocked or were continually sitting in water. These plants were drowning with no oxygen for roots. I tipped the sodden pots on their side and left them like that until the excess water drained away, then added slow release fertiliser, as nutrients will have washed away.

I broke up clumps of Spring bulbs a few weeks ago and got around to planting them out this week. The tops had died back and they had dried nicely for planting in groups of 5. Spring bulbs should be coming into Garden Centres soon. Lilly bulbs cannot be left like that - they must never dry out. Lawns: If your lawns were fed during the rain and have thickened up, keep the blades up a notch to what you usually have them set from now on, to give needed shade to roots.With nightly dews back, lawns should stay lush now through to Autumn - if the grass grub leave them alone....

Vegetables:

February is usually our hottest month, but this year January scorched the ground first and with vegetable gardens being open to the sun, they have suffered - dig compost, blood and bone or old stable manure into depleted areas



and soak well to bring the worms back up, then let all settle until the worst of the heat is over, before planting out leaf veg, which will only bolt to seed right now - sowing veg seed would be the best option. Garlic should be harvested and drying by now - remember to put aside the best bulbs for planting on the shortest day for next years crop. **Fruit:**

Can't complain about fruit not ripening this year - so nice to eat fruit straight from the tree or vine. Garden Centres are ordering now, so this is a good time to get an order for trees you would like to fruit at your place. Grapes are plumping up - time to cover from hungry birds...

Headaches

Headache includes many types of head and facial pain. It is the most common form of pain and a major reason people miss work or school. Most headaches are not a cause for concern; however, if they keep occurring, see your doctor to help find ways to reduce the impact on your life.

When to seek urgent medical care

Sometimes a headache is a sign of a more serious problem. You should get a headache checked right away if you have any of the following symptoms:

- a really severe headache that comes on suddenly 'out of the blue'
- nausea, a stiff neck, rash, fever, shakes or are sensitive to light (warning signs of meningococcal disease or meningitis)
- your headache follows a head injury.

Call Healthline 0800 611 116 if you are unsure what you should do.

Types of headaches

There are many types of headaches. These vary in how severe they are, how long they last, how they feel, their causes, and how they respond to different treatments.

The most common types include:

- Tension headaches the most common type of headache. A dull pain that feels like someone is tightening a band around your head or blowing a balloon up inside your head.
- Migraine may be like tension headache but it is usually one-sided, pulsating, more severe and debilitating.
- Cluster headaches are repeated, sudden, short-lived, usually one-sided and severe, frontal headaches (often 'behind the eye').
- Chronic daily headache may be any form of headache that recurs on a daily, or near daily, basis

What causes headaches?

There are many different causes of headaches including:

- muscle tension
- an infection elsewhere in your body
- inflamed arteries (which cause migraine or cluster headaches)
- the toxic effects of alcohol or other substances.

Headaches can be triggered by stress, tiredness, hunger, certain foods, eyestrain, noise or bright light.

When to see your doctor about headache

Usually, headaches go away given time, rest and/or treatment with a pain relief medication. You should see your doctor if:

- headaches remain frequent, persistent or worsen
- you get no relief from simple pain relievers
- you take simple pain relievers more than twice a week
- you were headache-free but now get them
- your headache is triggered by standing up, coughing, straining, physical exertion or sexual intercourse
- you are over 50 and start to get regular headaches or there is face or jaw pain.

If a friend or family member has any of the urgent symptoms listed in the box at the top of this page, seek immediate medical help.

Your Cell Phone – Friend or Foe?

I have a background in marketing. And marketing, let me tell you, is a lot about psychology. Or to put a finer and more accurate point on it, psychological manipulation.

And the trendiest, highest-paid and most prestigious place for a marketer to be carving out and progressing his or her career today, is in the "tech" industry.

So do you reckon this, sexiest-of-all-industries', swathes of highly educated marketers know a thing or two about how to engage you with their software, devices and uber-profitgenerating plans and schemes? You betcha.

From colours designed to prompt specific neurological / biochemistry reactions (and thus, marketer-desired behaviours), to music with certain beats, to micro-manipulated page placement strategies . . . and things waaayyyy too techie (and devious) for me to even *try* to explain.

At the level of the individual tactic, you'll be alert to some, you'll be aware of others in retrospect, and some, you'll never become aware of at all.

Here's the Elephant in the Room.

Here's the cumulative and ultimate effect: It's likely you're spending more and more of your day, every day, with your nose glued to your little hand-sized slice of metal and silicon.

Is it all necesssary? Is it all productive, intelligently-invested time? And, truth be told, is all of that time actually particularly enjoyable? Is it adding tangible value, emotional enrichment or genuine intellectual stimulation to your life? Or is it just an addiction? And, is it setting a good example for your kids?

To whatever degree your answer to the above questions is "no", that's the degree to which Silicon Valley's sharp and techie (and often ruthless) designers, developers and marketers are **controlling YOUR life.**

Don't Like the Idea of Being Controlled?

Aside from exercising a little (or a lot) of self-reflection and some self-discipline, here are a few quick, painless and practical manoeuvres to at least help "un-gotcha" yourself from your "tech":

- Turn social media off. Limit its use to a fixed-location device. You don't need to carry it around with you all day.
- Turn off all notifications so that calls, emails and texts from actual humans are all you receive. That way you can't get inadvertently dragged into a marketing-driven time suckhole.
- Ditch everything except the essentials from your home screen.
- If your model of mobile phone lets you choose muted colour display or full grayscale, do so. That way, you're not constantly tempted by the screen equivalent of a bright and shiny new object suddenly coming into view.

First frozen meat shipment leaves New Zealand 15 February 1882

New Zealand's first successful shipment of frozen meat to Britain in 1882 had a huge impact on the colony, paving the way for the trade in frozen meat and dairy products that became the cornerstone of New Zealand's 20th-century economy.

The Dunedin's voyage was organised by William Soltau Davidson, the Britishbased general manager of the New Zealand and Australian Land Company, whose landholdings in the two countries exceeded 1 million hectares. The entrepreneurial Davidson had taken a keen interest in experiments from 1876, which had proved the concept, if not yet the economic viability, of shipping frozen meat around the globe.

Davidson decided to fit out a passenger sailing ship, the Albion Line's Dunedin, with a coal-powered Bell Coleman freezing plant, which cooled the entire hold to 22 degrees celsius below the outside temperature. Company employee Thomas Brydone was sent to Britain to study refrigeration technology and then handled the experiment in New Zealand.

Most of the first cargo originated from Brydone's slaughterhouse at Totara Estate, Oamaru. Sent by rail to Port Chalmers in iceboxes, the mutton and lamb carcasses were frozen aboard the Dunedin. Despite mechanical problems, the plant froze nearly 10,000 carcasses in two months.

About 5000 carcasses were on board the Dunedin when it sailed on 15 February. When the vessel became becalmed in the tropics, crew noticed that the cold air in the hold was not circulating properly. To save his historic cargo, Captain John Whitson crawled inside and sawed extra air holes, almost freezing to death in the process. Crew members managed to pull him out by a rope and resuscitated him. When the Dunedin arrived in London in late May, only one carcass had to be condemned and the cargo's superiority over Australian shipments was remarked on.

More than a single successful shipment was needed to create a new industry. Davidson set to work creating a marketing and insurance structure to underpin refrigerated shipping. The new technology ultimately enabled the owner-operated (family) farm to become the standard economic unit in rural New Zealand for the next century.

The Dunedin made another nine successful voyages before disappearing in the Southern Ocean in 1890.
