The end of mellow May, leads us into a new month bringing different gardening challenges with the start of Winter's chills. Nature has a way of putting all right - after those strong drying winds last week, it rained and the ground should stay damp now, which is perfect for applying compost /

mulch / pea straw to bed gardens to keep soil warmer against freezing frosts and wind.

Roses: flowering is at the end - don't be tempted to cut spent flower heads off. Leave all types of Roses to make seed and harden wood before the big prune at the end of next month. A clean up spray with Lime Sulphur on all Rose bushes and climbers - as well as the ground where they are growing, to kill all fungus and disease remaining from Summer flowering. Lime Sulphur smells like rotten eggs when first applied - is safe for Bees and is also the spray to use for the removal of Lichen and Moss growing on branches of trees and Shrubs.

New seasons bare rooted Roses should be arriving in Garden centres soon, so if you plan to plant a certain type of Rose or shades, ask a Garden Centre to hold them for you so you don't miss out. Prepare ground now by digging in old stable manure or bagged Rose mix. If planting a Rose in the same place a Rose has been growing, you will need to remove the soil and replace with soil from another part of the garden - disease is transferred very quickly from one Rose to another. Bare rooted, Winter planted Roses are less likely to suffer from planting stress.

Dahlias finish quickly after being frosted. Let foliage die back for a while before cutting back, as leaves gather sunlight and provide nourishment for next years blooming. Here on the coast, tubers can be left in well drained gardens - if left in gardens that hold water and freeze, they will rot. In very cold areas, dig tubers about a week after they become frost affected and let air dry for several days. Store in a cool location packed in slightly damp straw and replant in Spring, when danger of frost has past.

Re-pot container grown Buxus. If they look pot bound, Buxus root growth is prolific and they don't seem to suffer from the removal of half the root ball. Replace potting mix with new.

Winter colour: Plant annuals on offer now, to get them well on while there is still heat in the sun. I have Stock, Wallflower, Sweet Peas, Polyanthus, Pansies, Poppy and Primula Malacoides almost at bud stage. If a mild Winter. they should keep growing to flower - if a hard Winter, they will sit until soil begins to warm in early Spring. The recent rains perked dry lawns up, but growth should be

slowing right down now bringing lawns to that tuffty stage. Here in our garden, lawn mowers will still be on the go until the last of the leaves have been picked up. Next time it rains, have some lawn fertiliser on hand and a week after feeding, sprinkle some garden lime over lawns for a boost before they stop growing. A hard cracking lawn is an indication of high clay content in soil, which would benefit greatly from a dressing of Gypsum clay breaker - a soil conditioner improving soil structure, aeration and assists drainage and moisture retention. Applied annually, hard lawns will soon get a spring in them.

On the coast Sow broad beans, garlic, shallots and rhubarb. Colder areas nothing much can be planted without protection.

Fruit: Bare rooted fruit trees will be arriving in Garden Centres soon - so good to pick fruit from your own garden - order the trees you plan to grow now, then prepare ground for them. Choose an open, sunny position, sheltered from strong winds. Fruit trees grow in a wide range of soil types, as long as there is good drainage.

Thinking about your finances when selling

Summary of important things to know

- Bridging finance is helpful if you are buying a new home before selling your current property, but be aware of the cost and risks.
- The real estate agent's commission is usually paid from the purchase deposit the buyer pays when you sign the sale and purchase agreement.
- The remaining price is paid on settlement day, usually to your lawyer or conveyancer who will arrange settlement.
- You need to check with IRD if there is any tax to pay on the sale of your property.
- There are additional costs such as legal fees, advertising and moving expenses to budget for when selling.

Considering bridging finance

Bridging loans are helpful if you are buying a new property before selling your current home.

You will usually pay for the interest only until your current property is sold, but in effect, you need to budget to pay for two home loans over this period.

This is a risk if your current home takes a while to sell, and if your current home sells for less than expected, you could be left with a larger home loan to repay than you had planned for.

Receiving payment for your property

Your lawyer or conveyancer will work with the buyer's lawyer or conveyancer and your bank (if you have a home loan) to manage payment on settlement day. This is the day that the remainder of the purchase price will be paid by the buyer. If you have paid rates or body corporate fees in advance, these will be also be included in the buyer's payment.

Agent's commission

The real estate agent's commission is usually paid from the buyer's purchase deposit before the agency passes the deposit to your lawyer or conveyancer.

Budget for the additional costs of selling

- Any renovations and other costs to prepare your property for sale.
- Advertising costs to sell your property, which are usually paid up front when you sign an agency agreement.
- Building inspection reports, including a council LIM report and a building inspection report if you are providing these for buyers.
- Lawyer's or conveyancer's fees. These may be deducted from the final settlement before it is paid to you.
- Moving costs, including reconnecting services.

YES – This can be immensely helpful as one of the conditions often put in a contract relates to obtaining satisfactory insurance cover. Most if not all insurance companies require all homes/buildings pre-1935 to get reports on electrics, plumbing and building condition. You as an owner can address any matter raised in these reports prior to selling. You can safe guard your potential sale from falling over due to either addressing yourself or disclosing to your agent and with your consent inform purchasers of any matters raised. You may think by not disclosing any material matters regarding your property could save you money – Actually Not!

- The Real Estate Agents Act (Sections 134-137)
- The Contractual Remedies Act (Section 6)
- The Fair-Trading Act 1986 (Section 9, 12Á & 14)
- The Consumer Guarantees Act 1993

These are all pieces of legislation protecting buyers when dealing with either an owner (private Seller) or Real Estate salesperson/ Agent regarding disclosure.

My child walks pigeon-toed, what should I do?

Have you noticed your child is walking pigeon toed or is intoeing? Read on to find out why it happens and what you should do...

Typically our feet point straight ahead or slightly outwards, but in some people, due to a range of causes their feet point inward. This is called intoeing or being "pigeon toed". Intoeing is very common in many young children, with most children under the age of two years having some degree of intoeing as part of their normal development, however this should reduce with time. Children that intoe may have difficulty sitting in a cross-legged position and tend to "W" sit on their knees with their feet flared out behind/beside them. Intoeing may cause your child to stumble, trip, appear clumsy and/or have difficulty running. You may also be experience difficulty getting their shoes to fit correctly and some children may be concerned about their feet looking different.

Intoeing can run in the family and is typically due to three main causative conditions including Metatarsus adductus (curved foot), Femoral torsion (twisted thighbone) or Tibial torsion (twisted shin). Causes of intoeing can spontaneously resolve through early childhood with bone development and not require treatment. However, if the degree of intoeing is severe or it does not resolve over time an appointment for your child with us at Simply Feet Podiatry will be beneficial where we can assess intoeing severity and formulate a subjective treatment plan. Treatments may range from conservative gait plates, orthotics, exercises and

footwear to referral for surgical correction for severe late stages cases depending on causative factors.
