Some much needed rain for gardens last Monday night - but still too many dull days making them shorter than usual for May. A heap of work was done here in our garden this week, with compost going down fast and as leaves and annual weeds are removed from gardens, it gets shovelled on thickly around plants.

However not quite ready for the pea straw cover yet as still a few more leaves to fall and collect. A good watering is required before straw goes on if the rain did not get down far.

Bearded Iris rhizomes and Freesia bulbs will have pushed up, exposed to bake in the sun - so compost and mulch should be kept off.

Our garden gets carried away from time to time and tries to outgrow the size allotted to it!! Shrubs I planted and thought at the time I could keep shaped to fit a space - but after a while I get fed up with trying to keep them the right size - they are either dug out or dug up if manageable and given a ride in the wheelbarrow. Complete new garden rooms can be created by shifting tall front plantings to the back, which opens a space allowing room in the front to be edged and gravelled for the placing of seating - or maybe a statue or large ornate pot. Don't hesitate in reducing the height and width of trees and Shrubs. It is essential if garden space is limited, if only to let more light on to lower growing plants, stopping leggy growth and encouraging optimum flowering. If Shrubs have been wrenched to be shifted, height and width needs to be reduced to compensate for damaged roots.

I continue to divide overgrown perennial clumps - some to fill gaps and some to pot up and grow on until strong roots develop and fill pots before planting. Once plants have been sectioned and rearranged, cover beds and around plants with compost, which will encourage new root growth and help keep perennial beds warmer through the colder months. Lilies and Peony roses can be planted or shifted this month. Be careful not to break the fleshy scales on Lily bulbs and new shoots on Peony tubers.

Fruit and Veg.

Strawberries: Continue planting, raising the beds where drainage is suspect and adding manure rich compost to the beds.

Raspberries: When finished fruiting, cut fruiting stems back by half - the new tip growth will bear fruit. After that, cut those two year old canes back to the ground.

Apples: are still dripping from trees - best to pick for storing now before birds enjoy the lot. Leave pruning pip fruit until next month.

Continue planting Winter veg to get them going before soil gets too cold. Snow peas, Pak Choi, Kale, Broccoli, Cauliflower and Beetroot. Baby spinach in a kitchen window container picked often will supply needed greens over

Winter. This is the last month to sow Carrot seed, Onion sets (in punnets already at bulb stage) achieve better results now than planting seeds. *Cheers Linda*.

Let's talk about Sinusitis

The sinuses are designed to help insulate the skull and make it lighter, as well as provide resonance for our voice. These cavities contain their own defence system to keep out (or contain) bacteria and viral or fungal pathogens, which could cause infection. The mucus layer lining the membranes of the sinuses is filled with tiny hairs that are able to trap foreign invaders and propel them out of the sinuses. Unfortunately, this is not a fail-safe system, and infection does occur, causing sinusitis or inflammation of the sinuses, particularly when the immune system of the body is suppressed through stress, exhaustion or poor nutrition. The Sinusitis may be an isolated, acute episode, or chronic, recurrent episodes may develop. You are more likely to have an episode of sinusitis following a viral infection such as the common cold. The cold virus causes the nasal linings to swell, and mucus production to increase. This reduces the effective drainage of the nose, and produces a wonderful breeding ground for bacteria. Bacterial infections are likely when the symptoms have lasted more than one week. In acute sinus infections, the most likely bacteria involved are streptococcus pneumoniae and haemophilus influenzae, with staphylococcus it is often involved in chronic sinus infections. Treating a sinus infection usually involves several different treatment strategies. Anti Inflammatories to reduce the inflammation of the airways. Decongestants such as nasal sprays may help, but should be used sparingly and for no more than 3 days, as their effectiveness then decreases and rebound congestion occurs. Oral decongestants can also help reduce nasal inflammation. If the symptoms last more than one week, it is important to check with the pharmacist or seek medical advice.

To help to drain the nasal passages it is recommended to drink lots of fluids especially water and hot herbal teas; have a steam inhalation 2–3 times a day using hot water with some added tea tree oil, menthol or eucalyptus. Cover your head and the bowl with a towel, and inhale the steam deeply, taking care to keep your eyes closed! Repeat for 3-4 minutes. Expectorants can also help to thin the nasal mucus. Antihistamines may be needed if the underlying cause of nasal swelling is an allergic reaction. Allergens cause the white blood cells in blood and tissues to release histamine into circulation. This causes fluid to leak from the blood vessels into the tissues of the nasal passages causing congestion. Sometimes allergies to dust mites can lead to chronic sinusitis. Allergy to fungi may also be associated with nasal polyps and asthma. Damp living conditions and exposure to environmental pollutants can also cause chronic sinusitis.

If you are a regular sinusitis sufferer it is important not to smoke, and to avoid environments where you are exposed to second-hand smoke. Drinking alcohol causes swelling and congestion of the nasal membranes in a lot of people, so not drinking, or moderating your alcohol intake is a good idea. There may be an interesting connection between chronic sinus issues and the presence of bacteria in the stomach. A good probiotic also can help to manage symptoms.

What you need to know about hemp seed oil.

What is Hemp? Hemp is grown for the production of many products ranging from clothing

many products ranging from clothing and makeup to paper and cereal. In short, hemp is a raw material, much like

cotton or wood. The seeds are ground for their oil and the seed cake that remains after this process is used in pet food and body care products, and now can be used in human food. **How is it different to marijuana?**

Much of the confusion around hemp is from the fact that marijuana and hemp are both plants in the same genus or category called "cannabis." Within this genus are three species and many sub-types, often called strains or cultivars. Hemp commonly means a cannabis cultivar that produces little to no THC, the primary psychoactive compound found in marijuana.

Is it legal?

The sale of hemp seed oil as food has been legal in New Zealand since 2002. Hemp seed oil was the only hemp derived product that could be legally sold as a food or added to a food in New Zealand until November 2018 when the law changed. The legislation now allows the sale of hemp seeds as a food. Many products are now available in the form of whole seeds, hulled seeds, protein powders and flour. **What is hemp oil?**

Hemp seed oil is processed from the seeds harvested from the cannabis sativa plant. Hemp seed oil is made by pressing hemp seeds, similar to how olive oil is made by pressing whole olives. Like the hemp plant, the seeds contain no THC.

REALFOOD PANTRY - RECIPE CARROT CAKE

This is a moist delicious cake. This recipe will make a larger than average size cake. The recipe is reprinted from "A Vegetable Cookbook" by Digby Law (Hodder & Stoughton) by kind permission of the author. The cake will freeze well, when complete.

1 ¹/₂ CUPS PEANUT OIL

- 2 CUPS RAW SUGAR, 4 EGGS
- 1 TEASPOON VANILLA ESSENCE
- 2 CUPS WHOLEMEAL FLOUR
- 1 ¹/₂ TEASPOONS CINNAMON
- **1 TEASPOON SALT**
- 3 CUPS GRATED CARROT (DO NOT GRATE IN ADVANCE - THIS WILL MAKE THE CAKE LESS MOIST) 1 CUP CHOPPED WALNUTS

2 TEASPOONS SIFTED BAKING SODA Mix together peanut oil and raw sugar. Beat eggs lightly. add vanilla essence and add to the oil and sugar mixture. In a large bowl mix wh0lemeal flour. cinnamon. salt. grated carrot and chopped walnuts. Mix everything together. At the last minute mix in sifted baking soda. Have ready an extra large greased and floured cake tin. pour in the mixture and bake at 160°C for 55 minutes at centre of oven or until cooked. Remember though that it is a very moist cake. When cool ice with cream cheese icing and

sprinkle with chopped walnuts.

CREAM CHEESE ICING

This is an excellent icing which can be adapted tor other cakes. Note that cream cheese is sold with different consistencies. Look for a shiny. stiff variety - the very soft ones will not hold the icing on the top of the cake.

375G CREAM CHEESE, 1/4 CUP ICING SUGAR, 1 TEASPOON VANILLA ESSENCE, 1/4 CUP MELTED BUTTER 56g, Beat ingredients together till smooth


