Fantastic we have SUN! After all that lovely rain soaking down to where it is needed in Spring. Every day something new and beautiful greets me in our garden - this week fragrant Lilac, Irises, Viburnum, English Abutilon and Kowhai to please the birds. If you need to shift Rhododendrons, Azaleas or Camellias - do it immediately after they and if your

flowering, before they put on their new season growth, and if your Spring flowering Shrubs are in need of a trim ,prune them back once they have finished flowering.

Mulching right now will help keep the moisture we now have, deep down where it will be needed if we get those October winds. Mulch breaking down into soil will not only retain moisture but improves soil structure while suppressing weed growth. Mulch can be straw, grass clippings, soft hedge clippings or weed free compost to keep exposed soil from baking while plants are establishing. To create a new top soil, continual mulching plus Gypsum breaking down into clay or poor draining soil will eventually convert poor soil into good growing soil. **Geraniums and Pelargoniums** are available now and should be

planted in a sunny position where roots will never sit in water. **Fuchsias** are also on offer - they benefit from moist soil and afternoon shade to thrive as do **Hydrangeas** - both Fuchsias and Hydrangeas take over from Spring flowering Shrubs to give Summer and Autumn colour and there are so many beautiful varieties to choose from.

Dahlias, will be shooting now - tubers will rot if sitting in wet ground too long - good drainage and full sun is the place for them.

Roses should now have new growth, this is the month to feed them with slow release Fertiliser which will add nutrients to roots when ever water is applied.

Potted plants also need slow release fertiliser. Re-pot any plants that have been in the same container for more than three years. Pot bound plants will need have the root ball removed, using a sharp spade, and can probably go into the same pot once most of the old potting mix is removed and fresh mix and water crystals are packed around the roots. **Cymbidium Orchids** can be divided and re-potted now if crowded -

and time to look for shoots appearing on tuberous Begonias. If they are beginning to move, divide if needed by slicing with a sharp knife at an eye, then bed into damp sawdust until ready to plant.

Water lilies are available this month and need to be planted in a basket lined with Sphagnum Moss or a double layer of Chux dish cloths, then add garden soil, slow release fertiliser or manure, more soil then the Lily and lastly a thick layer of shingle placed on top to help weigh the basket down in the water and stop the fertiliser / manure leaching out, which will create green slime growth in the pond..

Lawns: Moss will be a problem in lawns after all the rain - I will be dealing to mine with Sulphate of Iron watered on with a watering can (directions on the back of pack). Moss will turn black and die, rake out with a metal rake, loosen soil and re-sow with grass seed. Poor drainage, shade or compacted soil will be the reason Moss takes hold. Aerating with a fork or spiky shoes, a top dressing with compost will add humus and encourage worms. Lawn weed spraying will work now also - I like to spot spray only in the hope of missing as many worms as I can.

Fruit and veg: Right now in the veg garden there will be Potatoes being mounded, planting of Beans and Salad Greens, Peas, and Beetroot. Pumpkin and Corn can be planted now also. That fabulous pig manure is on offer again - spread on top of soil to suppress weeds and the worms will take it down

Grapes are beginning to show leaf - if dampness hangs about, they could be affected by fungus - if noticed spray with an organic fungicide while growth is new and continue until days become hot and dry Codling Moths: If you have had trouble in the past with Codling Moth, get traps in place now before fruit forms. Codling Moths attack Apples, Pears, Walnuts, Quinces, Crab Apples and stone fruit such as Plums and Peaches. The females lay their eggs on the foliage near a young fruit and when the grub hatches, it crawls to the fruit and eats its way inside. Once inside it is very hard to control. After a period of time of feeding it emerges and forms a cocoon in the loose bark or under the tree, where it will Winter over to emerge as a Moth in the Spring/Summer and start the cycle again. A female moth can lay up to 300 eggs during her short life. Some trees never attract the moth, but if one does you can be sure others will be chosen close by. Eradication of codling moth: Quarter fill a tin or plastic milk container with treacle and hang in the tree to attract male grubs - the treacle is said to smell like the female pheromone which will attract the male grub into the container to reach a sticky end. A double bonus is that the treacle will attract grub eating birds.

Let's talk about Allergies

You certainly see an increase in the hay fever type of illnesses with the allergens that float around as you get to the warmer months. For hundreds of thousands of people however, Spring brings with it pollen and the misery of hay fever. Allergies are the most common chronic health condition affecting New Zealanders. At least one in five is affected, and this is likely to rise. Allergies are caused by the immune system overreacting to something that is otherwise harmless to most people. Allergic Rhinitis, most commonly known as hay fever is the most common symptom of allergies. It causes a recurrent runny, stuffy, itchy nose, and frequent sneezing. It can also affect the sinuses, throat and ears. It may affect the eyes for some people, as the protein found in pollen can cause their eyes to become irritated and inflamed, this can become quite uncomfortable and even debilitating preventing you from enjoying warm, sunny days when the pollen count is at its highest.

Fortunately there are many products available to treat and prevent allergy symptoms. Such as nasal sprays, antihistamine tablets, eye drops, and health supplements. Other ways to help protect you against Allergic Rhinitis are keeping your home and car windows closed on windy days during the pollen season (August to March), avoid mowing lawns or walking in long grass and wear close fitting sunglasses. Reduce house-dust mites by vacuuming often and shampooing the carpet regularly. Consider using dust-mite-proof covers for mattresses, duvets and pillows. Keep pets outdoors and regularly vacuum their hair or fur off the floor and furniture. Avoid dry dusting instead use a damp cloth to wipe over surfaces. Hot wash bed linen weekly, and air blankets in the sun for about 4 hours to kill dust mites.

Update Microsoft Windows computer

Researchers from the University of Otago

will be in Oamaru at the end of the month signing people up for the Free Meds Study. Lead researcher Professor Pauline Norris, says "we know that a lot of people struggle to pay the \$5 prescription charges, so we are doing the study to find out whether free prescriptions would improve people's health". People participating in the study will get either free prescriptions for a year (from 1 Feb 2020), or \$100 at the end of the study year. The team are looking for people over 18, living in the North End of Oamaru, who are either taking medicine for diabetes or taking antipsychotic medicines like quetiapine. The study is funded by the Health Research Council and has been approved by the Health and Disability Ethics Committee.

The research team will be in Oamaru on Wed 30th and Thursday 31st of October. They will be at the Hospice Hub (just next to the Hospice shop) at 343 Thames Highway from 12 noon until 7pm each day, so if you think you might be interested in participating please drop in.

Duck hunting still going ahead next year

Information spread by the Coalition of Licenced Firearms Owners (COLFO) and picked up by ACT's David Seymour is incorrect.

Our interpretation of the act is that steel shotgun ammunition is not classified as prohibited ammunition by the Arms (Prohibited Ammunition) Order 2019. The ammunition that is referred to is rifle ammunition with a steel core designed to defeat body armour NOT steel shotgun ammunition.

Fish & Game has been working with the hunting sector to provide meaningful enhancements to the new Arms Legislation Bill that will increase public safety.

"This is a time when firearms groups should be working together for the public good".

"Fish & Game advocates for and represents over 40,000 Game bird hunters around New Zealand, and steel shot is used by these hunters to keep toxic lead out of the environment. We would be shocked if the environmental benefits of steel shot were outlawed". *Fish and Game NZ*

REALFOOD PANTRY

Yeast spread - Like Marmite

1 cup Brewers yeast, ³/₄ cup warm water

1 Tbs Soya sauce, 1 tsp salt (flavoured eg celery)

1 tsp celery seed (optional)

Fighting for the eight-hour working day

Labour Day commemorates the struggle for an eight-hour working day. New Zealand workers were among the first in the world to claim this right when, in 1840, the carpenter Samuel Parnell won an eighthour day in Wellington. Labour Day was first celebrated in New Zealand on



28 October 1890, when several thousand trade union members and supporters attended parades in the main centres. Government employees were given the day off to attend the parades and many businesses closed for at least part of the day. The date, 28 October, marked the first anniversary of the establishment of the Maritime Council, an organisation of transport and mining unions. The fledgling union movement was decimated by defeat in a trans-Tasman Maritime Strike in late 1890 but, despite this, the first Labour Day was a huge success. In Wellington, the highlight was an appearance by the elderly Parnell, who died just a few weeks later. From the mid-1890s the union movement began to recover slowly under the Liberal government. The Liberals' industrial conciliation and arbitration system, introduced in 1894, earned New Zealand a reputation of being a 'working man's paradise' and a 'country without strikes'.

Early Labour Day parades drew huge crowds in places such as Palmerston North and Napier as well as in Auckland, Wellington, Christchurch and Dunedin. Unionists and supporters marched behind colourful banners and ornate floats, and the parades were followed by popular picnics and sports events.

These parades also had a political purpose. Although workers in some industries had long enjoyed an eight-hour day, it was not a legal entitlement. Other workers, including seamen, farm labourers, and hotel, restaurant and shop employees, still worked much longer hours. Many also endured unpleasant and sometimes dangerous working conditions. Unionists wanted the Liberals to pass legislation enforcing an eight-hour day for all workers, but the government was reluctant to antagonise the business community.

What the Liberals did do was make Labour Day a holiday. The Labour Day Act of 1899 created a statutory public holiday on the second Wednesday in October, first celebrated in 1900. The holiday was 'Mondayised' in 1910, and since then it has been held on the fourth Monday in October.

In the first decade of the 20th century industrial unrest reappeared. The Liberal government was in decline, prices were rising and the Arbitration Court was seen as reluctant to raise wages. The more militant labour movement that emerged from around 1908 rejected the Liberals' arbitration system and condemned the increasing commercialisation of Labour Day parades. Many floats advertised businesses as well as temperance organisations, theatres, circuses and patriotic causes. Some socialists promoted May Day (1 May) as an alternative celebration of workers' struggles. Although unionists and their supporters continued to hold popular gatherings and sports events, by the 1920s Labour Day had begun to decline as a public spectacle. For most New Zealanders, it was now just another holiday. *https://nzhistory.govt.nz/politics/labour-day*
