

After a few mild days last week, I got to thinking Spring is upon us early and quickened up the pruning along with feeding the garden with the lovely pig manure I have bagged on hand. Looking back through past notes, it reminded the "gardening me" about the past August - snow, harsh frosts and floods.....But the birds are wooing and singing Spring melodies, bees are buzzing and buds are swelling.



Plants do not go by our calendar, which means we need to read when it is becoming Spring in our own gardens and it will differ all around the district. However, dryness is affecting all gardens in North Otago, with many hoses out as they are here. A good soaking around roots right now, is far more beneficial than sprinklers. Plants that suffer most during a dry Winter are Maples, Rhododendrons, Camellias and Azaleas, because all have roots close to the ground surface.

Sowing seeds: It's the perfect time to sow seeds undercover any seeds that say Spring sowing on the back of the packet, will pop up now under cover. I use a tray of compost / soil with a layer of seed raising mix on the top - this way your seed raising mix will go further. Once sown, cover the trays with plastic or glass, but use spacers to let air circulate between the plastic / glass and tray. Softer shrubs that are encroaching on drive and walkways can be trimmed back, they will soon recover with new spring growth, also reduce the height on some of taller shrubs like Phebaliums, Pittosporums, Pseudopanax and the like now if you need to. You can do this without spoiling the shape, by cutting out the centre branch down to where the other branches bush out - this removes the natural point at the top of the Shrub and will sometimes reduce the height by 2 or more metres. New leaders will be sent up over time but more growth will be put into the side branching, which can be trimmed into shape if a problem. This being just the start of a new growing season, plants are intent on just growing. (Leave doing this for another month further inland.)

Slow release fertilizers are a safe bet for continual feeding over a long period - they are very clean and easy to apply and now days formulated to feed specific plants. Now would be a good time to mention those that resent being fed. Many South African plants and Australian natives such as proteas, Leucadendron's, Banksias, and all Grevillea's do not need feeding. I have lost some of these because they had absorbed fertilizer from neighbouring plants. There is still time to divide Hostas. These dramatic shade loving perennials can really highlight a shaded spot with their fresh greens and variegated light shades. Simply lift established clumps at least 4 to 5 years old, using a sharp spade to slice them into a few good sizes pieces, then replant. They also look great in pots, but get slug bait around them as soon as they start showing leaf - or try some of the slug repellent methods that have been passed down by gardeners listed below.

Fruit & Vegetables: Deciduous fruit trees and small fruiting bushes should be planted in August at the latest - this is also the time to give fruiting Shrubs & trees a dressing of potash to help with fruiting. If you plan to grow vegetables this year, get the garden ready now. Dig in some weed free compost and let the soil settle again while worms get to work. In areas you will not be planting out for a while, why not sow a green crop to add humus to tired soils- mustard, lupine, barley or wheat. These will germinate in no time here on the coast, but only when the ground is warm enough up further inland. Green crops should be dug in when lush, soft and green. Don't let it get to the flowering stalky stage, it takes too long to break down and is not worth the effort of digging in.

Cover leaf crops from birds or you will be left with stalks. Strawberry net framed over veg will keep them out. Cheers, Linda.

Let's talk about good gut health

The digestive system runs off a cascade of signals from one organ or area to the next, via the brain. The small intestine is where absorption of most of the nutrients in food begins. As food moves through the small bowel, digestive enzymes are secreted not only by the pancreas but also by the lining of the small intestine. The role of these enzymes is to continue what the stomach acid began, which is to continue to break down the food eaten into its smallest, most basic components. It is in the small intestine that you absorb most of the goodness (vitamins and minerals) from your food. A healthy gastrointestinal tract has an ideal balance of good and

A healthy gastrointestinal tract has an ideal balance of good and pathogenic bacteria. Unfortunately the ideal balance is easily disrupted by factors such as antibiotic use, agricultural chemicals and a diet high in preservatives and refined sugars. Gut flora promotes normal gastrointestinal function, provides protection from infection, regulates



metabolism and comprises more than 75 percent of our immune system. Taking probiotics in a supplemental form of bacteria can be beneficial. However, the gut environment needs to be supportive for the probiotic bacteria to take up residence there again and the right strains need to be used to support a return to a healthy gut flora profile. 3 Ripe Bananas, 50g Unsalted Butter, 1 teaspoon Bicarb/Baking Soda, Pinch of Salt, 1/2 to 1 teaspoon Ground Cinnamon (Optional), 1/3 to 1/2 Cup Coconut Sugar, 2 Eggs, 1 teaspoon Vanilla Extract, 1/2 Cup Coconut Flour Preheat the oven to 180C/350F, get out a loaf tin and line it with well greased baking paper. In a large bowl, mash the bananas until smooth. Melt the butter and then pour it over the mashed bananas. Stir through the bicarb/baking soda, salt, (optional) cinnamon and sugar. Must Visit The Catlins

The Catlins is part of the Southern Scenic route between Balclutha and Invercargill and can easily be visited and travelled in a day but I would recommend spending at least a night here to fully discover and enjoy all of its natural attractions.

The lighthouse at Nugget Point is probably the most visited spot in the Catlins and Purakaunui Falls is a highlight of this area. Cannibal Bay is a very rough and barren beach but if you are lucky you may be able to spot some sea lions.

Make sure you schedule a visit to Cathedral Caves which are only accessible 2 hours before low tide and one hour after low tide – because of limited cell phone coverage in the area it would pay too check tide times before your trip. Access to the caves is \$10 per adult and \$2 for a child.

Also, at low tide in the far south of the Catlins is Curio Bay where you can view a fossilised forest dating back to the Jurassic era. The bay is also home to a colony of yellow-eyed penguins. Next to Curio Bay is Porpoise Bay which is safe for swimming and surfing and hectors dolphins can often be seen here.
