Windy October to blow blossom from trees.... what a relief it was when the wind stopped and the rain fell last Tuesday. The late Prunus blossom, lolly pink Canzan, and Shimidsu Sakura - so prettily like pale pink ballerina tutus, are in full bloom this week - along with Bluebells carpeting gardens as Spring continues

here in North Otago.



Spring bulbs: As they start to finish, don't be tempted to cut leaves off just yet, as the bulbs top up on food for next year from leaves as they die back. Spent flower heads can be removed before seeds form. If you have really big clumps of bulbs choking your garden space, dig half out and plant somewhere else or donate to someone needing Spring bulbs.

Ericas that flowered over Winter can be trimmed when flowers brown - new growth will be fresh green through Summer. Ericas are such a wonderful ground cover displaying beautiful colour during Winter months. A low growing Erica will eventually cover a metre of ground and last for many years.

Lillies are really pushing up now, so it is a perfect time to get supports in for them, as well being careful not to damage bulbs. Lily bulbs need to be planted in a moist but well-draining soil. Mulching will stop soil drying out.

Prune Fuchsias back now if you have not already done so. Because they flower on new seasons wood, they can be taken well

Summer annuals: I have been planting groups of annuals for Summer colour - Cosmos, Lavatera, Love in the Mist, Sunflowers and Sweet Peas. When frosts are well behind us, Begonias, Petunias and Lobelia can be planted.

Too early yet to trim hedges - wait until the new growth finishes and firms up a little, or you will be trimming them twice - this applies to Box hedging as well - the test is to bend a stalk and if it snaps off, it will have hardened enough to trim. The perfect time to trim Spring growth on Box, is during overcast days - hot sun burns new undergrowth, dull days give them time to recover, although there will still be some burning which will soon be hidden by new

Lawns are responding to lawn food here; I am out with it each time it rains and popping flat weeds out with the point of my secateurs while lawns are damp and soft. If you feel you need to spray lawn weeds, grass clippings will need to be kept off gardens and compost heaps for a few cuts. Spray free lawn clippings will be beneficial as mulch around gardens, trees and shrubs to retain moisture - a dry Summer is predicted. Sifting soil will begin again here this week for re-sowing lawn bare patches.

Vegetables - Herbs: We can forget the dried Herbs in cooking now, as all Herbs are putting on nice fresh growth. Sage, Mint, Thyme, Rosemary, Bay, Marjoram, Oregano, Basil and even Nasturtium can be harvested, often during the growing season and what is not used, can be dried over Summer ready to rub and store for next Winter. For the most flavour, cut Herbs in mid-morning, right after the morning dew has dried.

Vegetable seeds can be sown directly into the garden now, but don't sow too thickly. Mix seeds with fine soil when sowing, to avoid a lot of thinning. If planting seedlings from punnets, cover with shade cloth so birds cannot see them, as they are bird feeding young now and they really like to strip small seedlings from gardens. Beans, Pumpkin types and Corn can go in the ground now, but protect during any cold nights.

Tomatoes: For those with glass or tunnel houses, prepare the soil well by digging in good organic compost, having been heated to the point of all fungus disease being eradicated. Summer nights here in North Otago can be cool, so a Glass or Tunnel house is a must, if wanting to be a serious Tomato grower. However, a glass house is a perfect incubator for fungus disease during nights and dull days, when moisture is not taken up quickly - never let Tomato plant leaves go into the night wet. There are a lot of Tomato varieties to choose from. Children love the Cherry Tomatoes, (a good lunch box filler .) Cherry Tomatoes can be grown in a large pot on a well-lit porch and will keep producing all Summer. Cheers, Linda

At this September's election, you will be asked if you want the End of Life Choice Act (EOLC Act) 2019 to come into force.

This Act is not about turning off life support, do-not-resuscitate requests, or allowing someone to refuse medical treatments (These are already legal in NZ). The EOLC Act is about giving doctors and nurse practitioners the legal power to assist in patient suicides, or to end the lives of their patients with lethal injection/dose upon request.

8 REASONS TO VOTE NO:

- 1. There is NO reliable safeguard to prevent someone being pressured into euthanasia or assisted suicide (one doctor is simply required to 'do their best' to detect pressure, and they can only speak to people that the patient lets them speak to).
- 2. NO independent witness is required at any point in the process even at the time the lethal dose is injected/taken.
- 3. There is NO protection against secret euthanasia or assisted suicide (family do not have to be consulted, or even informed).
- 4. There is NO requirement to ensure that the person is mentally competent on the day the lethal dose is injected/taken.
- There is NO protection for terminally ill people who are also depressed or mentally ill.
- There is NO required cooling-off period before the lethal dose is prescribed.
- 7. There is NO protection against medical errors about the course of an illness or how long a person has left to live.
- More than 200 lawyers and over 1600 doctors have publicly denounced this Act as bad law.

Waitaki & Oamaru Visitor Centre set to open

A Waitaki and Oamaru Visitor Centre incorporating the Waitaki Whitestone Geopark Information Shop with district attractions promotion and resources will open in the former Oamaru i-Site in building in lower Thames Street this week.

Tourism Waitaki, the Waitaki District Council and Waitaki Whitestone Geopark Trust will jointly fund the facility until at least March or April next year (COVID-19 dependent).

The Centre will initially be operated by Tourism Waitaki five days a week during school terms (closed Tuesday and Wednesday) between 10am and 4pm. During New Zealand's national holidays it will operate seven days a week. The Visitor Centre will offer district-wide and local information, including visitor guides and maps but would not be taking bookings on behalf of operators, General Manager of Tourism Waitaki Margaret Munro explained. Information on the geological sites and cultural histories associated with the Geopark has been relocated from the 'pop up shop' in Thames Street, and will be built up over time. "Locally, it will complement the information available at Rose's General Store in the Historic Precinct", she said. The i-Site was closed in June 2020 by TourismWaitaki when it was forced to restructure because of the severe reduction in income generated by the Oamaru Blue Penguin Colony due to COVID-19. The Information Centre at Omarama was also closed, and financial support for the Kurow Information Centre ceased. "We are pleased to have been able to offer part-time roles to some former staff affected by the restructure," Ms Munro explained. Financial support has been provided by the Waitaki District Council and the Whitestone Geopark Trust to enable the Centre to open. The Trust had recently closed its Thames Street "pop-up" centre and was currently relocating its information and displays into the Visitor Centre. Mayor Gary Kircher said, "I'm pleased that a solution has been found to the issue of how we provide information to our visitors. This is an important service which we need to maximise the time people spend in Waitaki, enjoying many of the wonderful attractions we have on offer! I appreciate the work that has happened behind the scenes to make this happen."



Let's Talk About Stroke Awareness

What is a stroke?

A stroke happens when a blockage such as a clot blocks the blood flow to the brain, or when a burst blood vessel bleeds into the brain. Strokes can be fatal. During a stroke, the cells in the affected part of the brain start to die and that part of the brain cannot work properly. This can affect a person's ability to walk, talk, eat, see, read, socialise or do things they were able to do before the stroke. They may also have fatigue or problems with remembering, understanding or thinking properly. Different parts of the brain control a person's movements, sense, emotions and intellectual functions. The effects of stroke depend on which part of the brain is damaged and how severe the damage is. Disabilities from stroke range from slight to severe. Some people make a speedy recovery and return to their normal lives. Others have disabilities that may improve with time and can be managed. For many, disabilities may last a lifetime. A small number of people will need full time medical care. Anyone can have a stroke. Although strokes often happen to older people, a quarter of all strokes in New Zealand occur in people still in the workforce or younger. Even children and babies have strokes. A stroke is largely preventable, yet each year about 9,000 people in this country have a stroke. This number would be more than halved if all the recommended actions to reduce stroke risks were taken in the community. There are things you can do to prevent strokes happening to you or someone you care about. Certain risk factors increase your chances of having a stroke.

- Check your blood pressure regularly so you can take steps to reduce if necessary.
- · Check your cholesterol so it can be reduced if the levels are too high.
- Check your heart beat. An irregular heartbeat called atrial fibrillation can cause stroke, but medication can treat this.
- Eat a healthy diet and reduce salt, this will help lower blood pressure and reduce cholesterol.
- · Stop smoking.
- · Move more.
- · Keep your alcohol intake low.
 - Lose weight.
- · Take medication as prescribed by your doctor.

If you believe someone is having a stroke, at any sign, act FAST and give someone the best chance of recovery. Any sign of stroke call 111 F Face- drooping on one side, A Arm- weakness on one side, S Speech- Mixed up, slurred or lost, T Take Action- Call 111 immediately.
